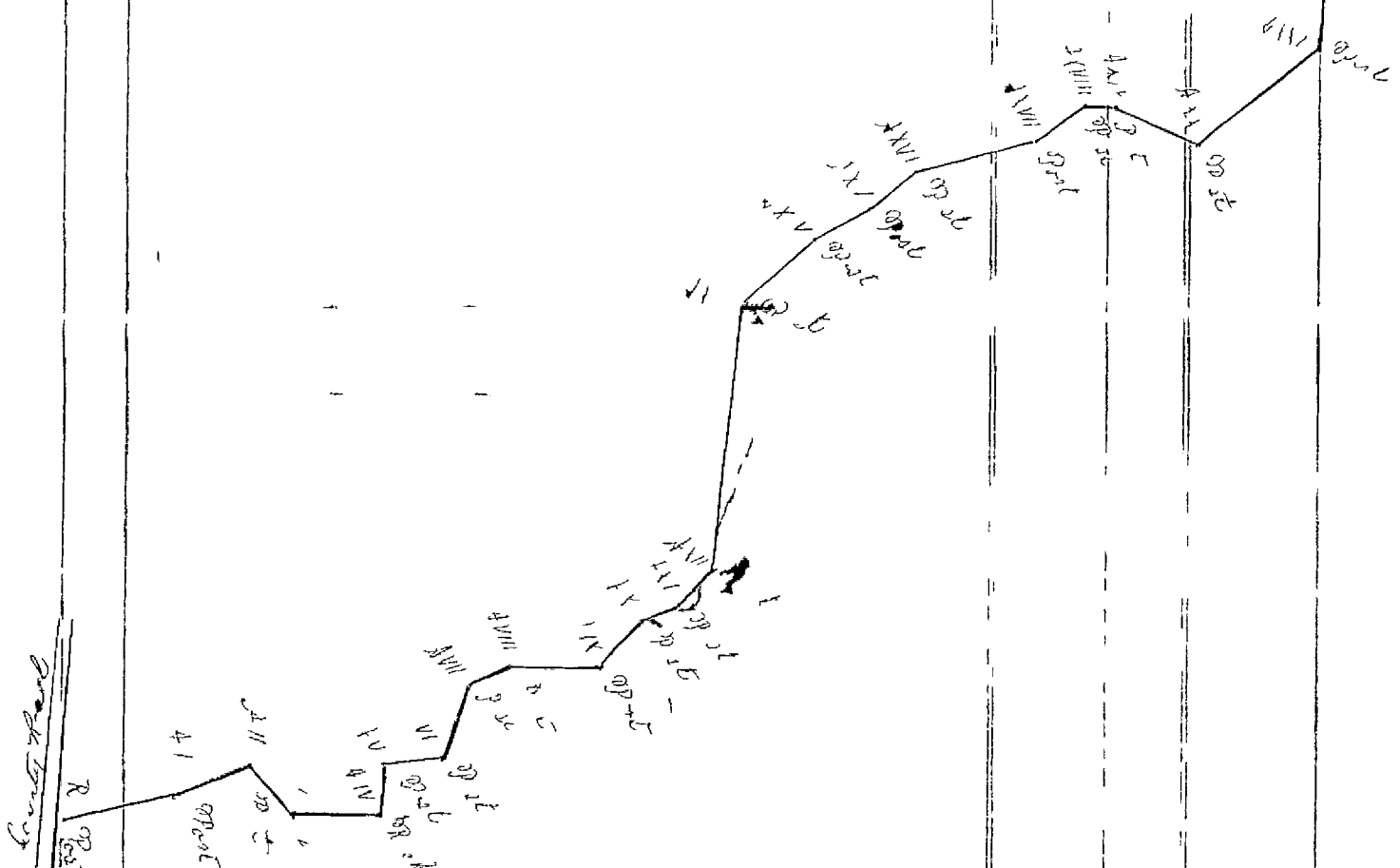
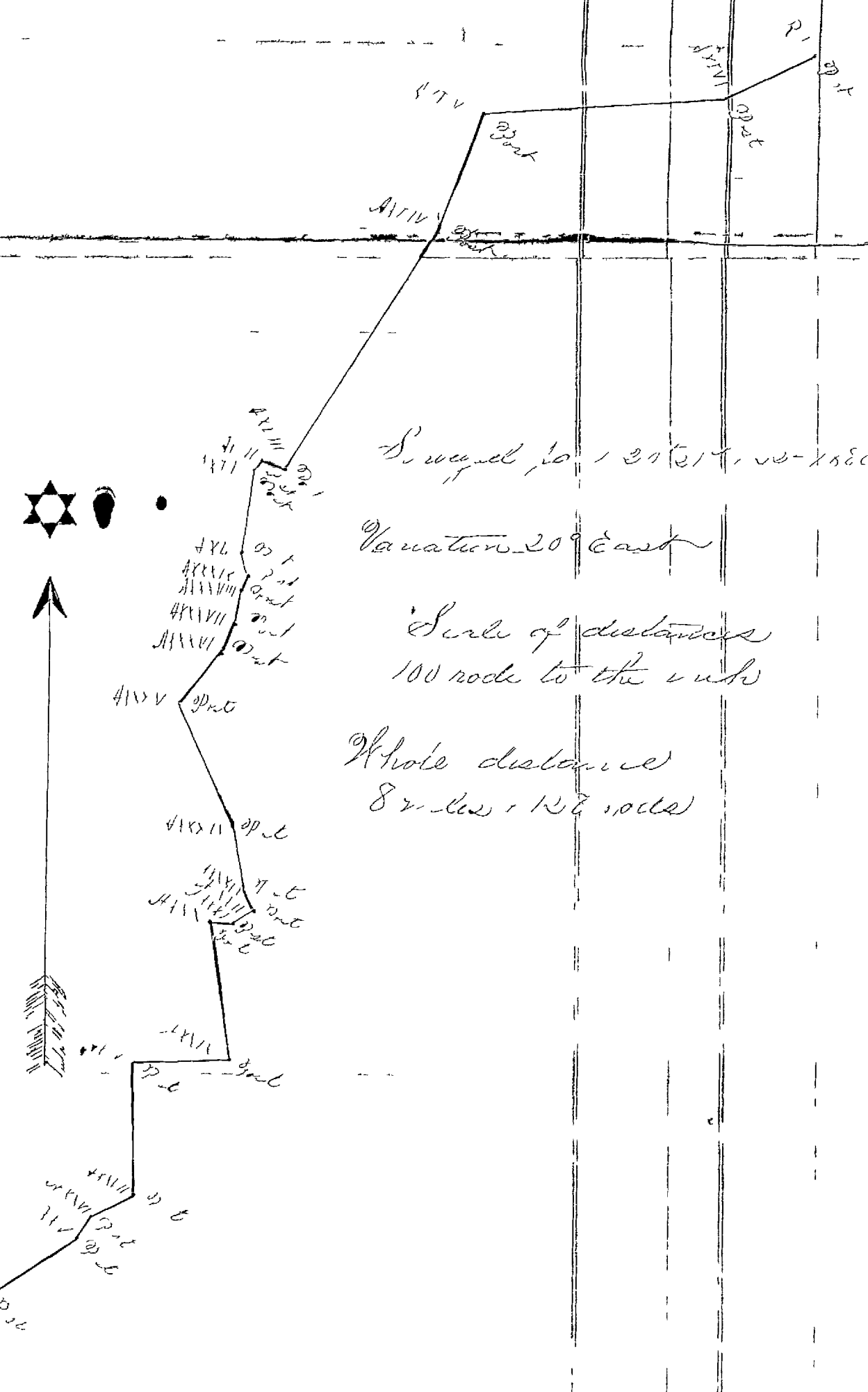

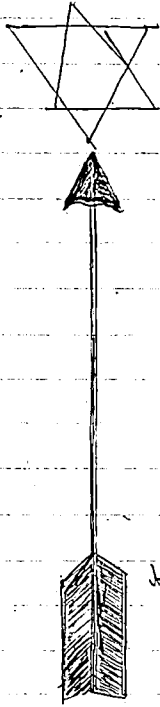

Survey of the Manselock Road

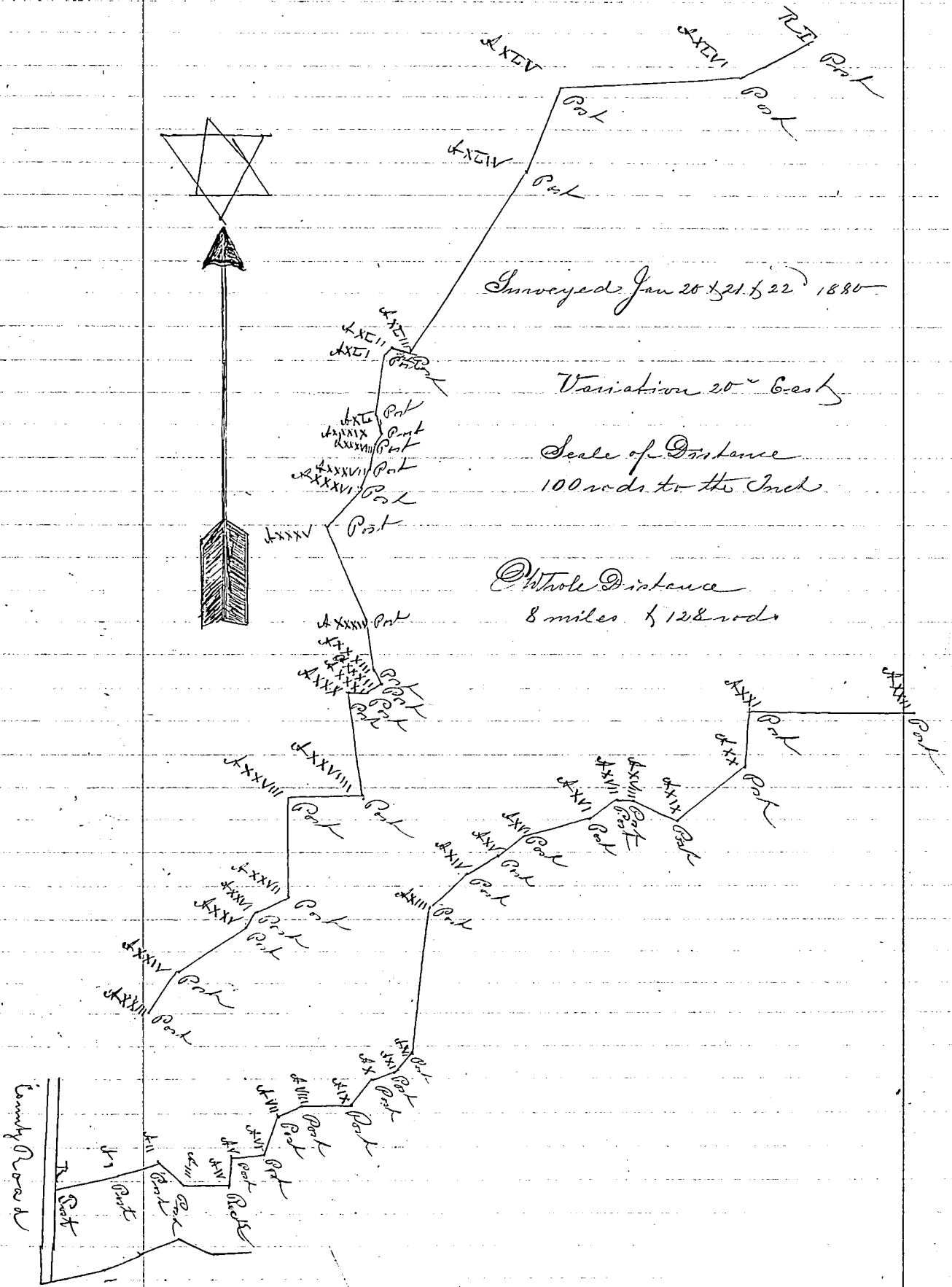


Surveyed Jan 20 + 21 + 22 1880
