Now at this time is presented to the Court the petition of James Henderson and fourteen others praying for the location of a County Road commencing at the N.E. Corner of the S.E. 1/4 of Sec 14 T. 3 S. R. 39. E. and it appearing to the Court from an examination of the petition that there are not twelve householders residing in the vicinity of the said proposed County Road signing said petition and that the law has not therefore been complied with It is ordered and adjudged by the Court that said petition be denied and dismissed at the costs of the petitioners.

In the matter of the Inquest  
on an unknown man  
found dead in Unatilla  
County.

Now at this time the County Clerk presents to the Court an Order drawn by the County Clerk of Unatilla County upon the Treasurer of said County in favor of Union County in payment of the expenses incurred by this County in the matter of holding an Inquest on the Body of an unknown man found in said Unatilla County to wit \$111.00 and thereupon it is ordered by the Court that the Clerk of this Court dispose of said warrant for an equal number of the outstanding warrants of this County, and that he pay said warrant to the Treasurer of this County taking his receipt therefor.

In the matter of Liquor License  
to Geo. W. Houlery

Now at this time is presented to the Court the petition of the legal voters of Joseph precinct in this County, praying that a license may be granted to Geo. W. Houlery authorizing him to keep and offer for sale, spirituous liquors in less quantities than one quart in said precinct - and it appearing to the Court from proof filed herein that all due and proper notice of the pendency of these proceedings has been given as by law required, that a good and sufficient bond has been filed
