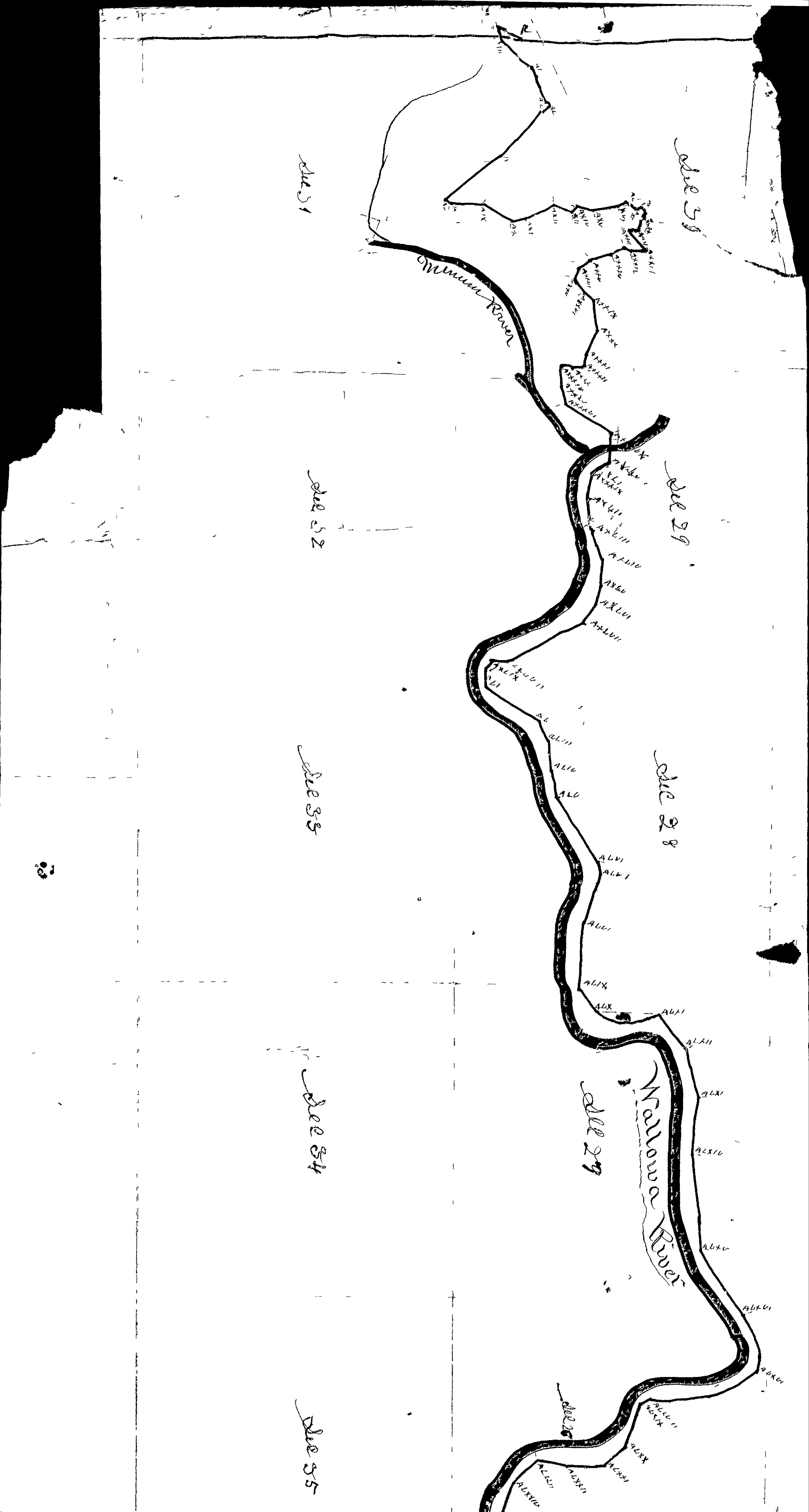

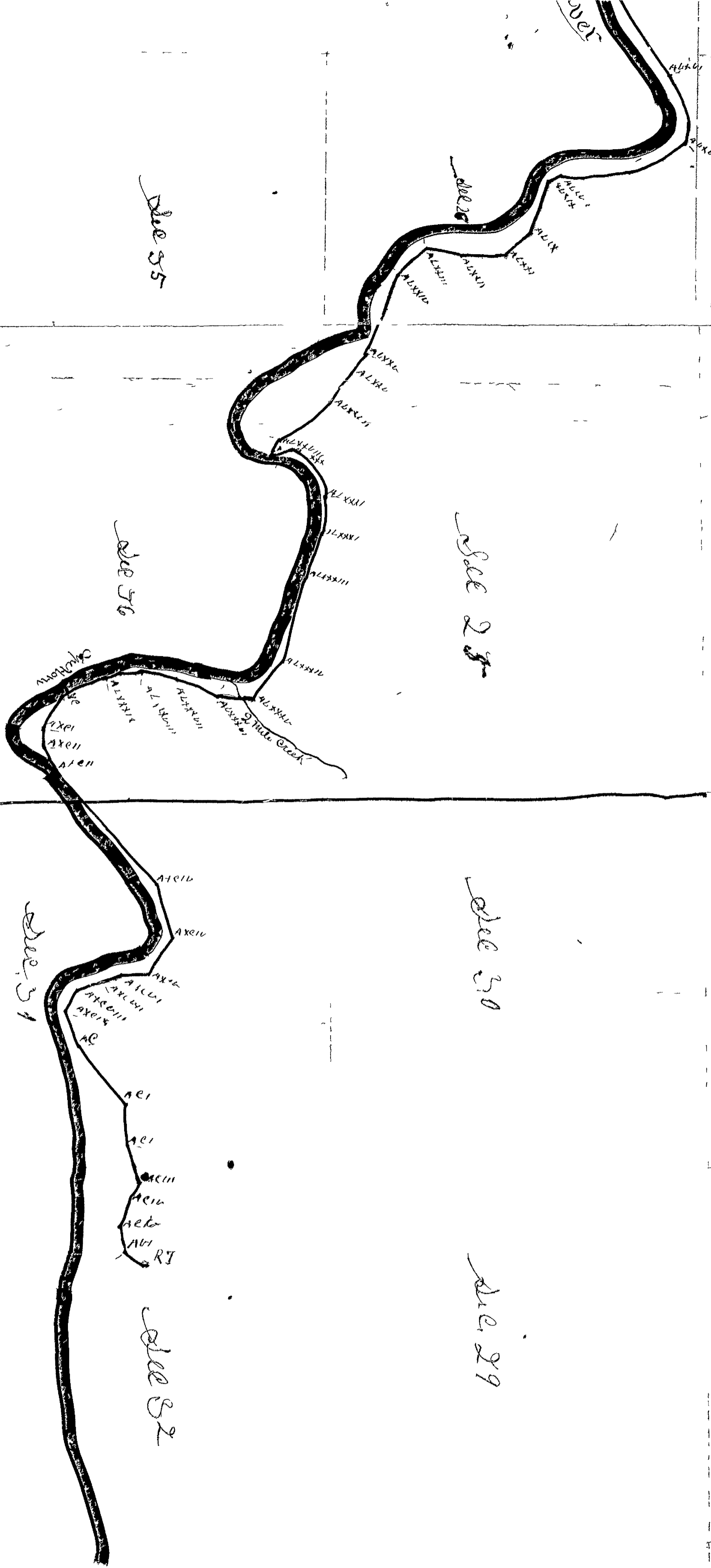

On the 23rd we took to our assistance two chain bearers and surveyed down the Minniss gulch. We surveyed again on the 25, 26, 27, 28th & 29th Day of October 1886. on said proposed Road according to your order and as shown by the Surveyors Plat and Report, Submitted herewith. We found the proposed road to be on very good ground and to be a public benefit and we therefore Recommend that it be established as a County Road.
