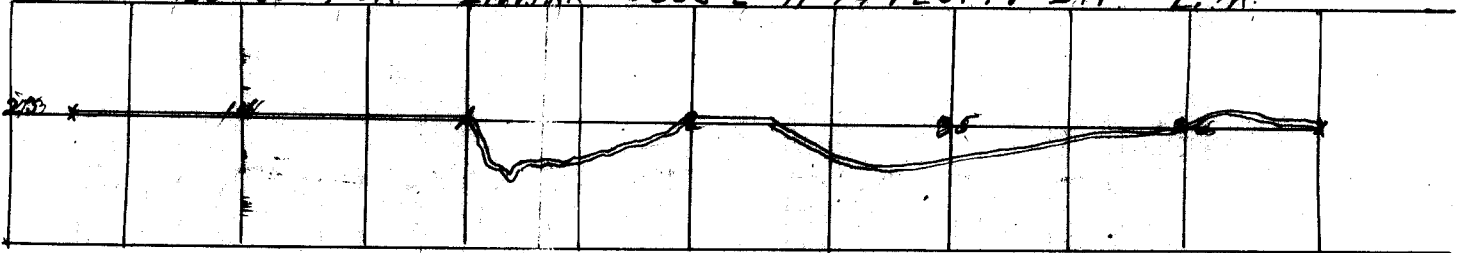

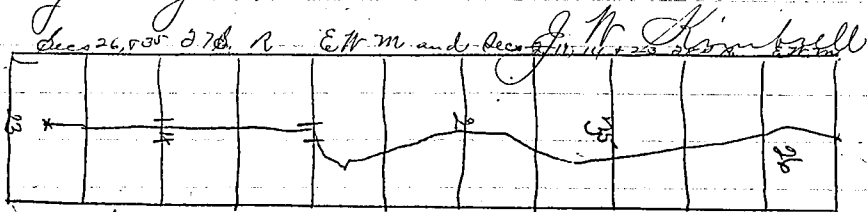

And that the reports of the viewers and Surveyor were regularly approved and recorded at that date viz. Jan 5th 1888. And it further appearing to the court that since said date the petitioners have deposited in this court said sum of \$25⁰⁰ and that said sum is now on deposit in this court subject to the order of said claimants, And all the proceedings herein having been regular and according to law, It is therefore considered, ordered and adjudged by the court, that said proposed road be and the same is hereby declared a public highway of Union County. And that the Clerk of this Court order the Supervision of Road District No 31 to open up said road according to law.

Thereupon it was ordered that the court be now adjourned till tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock.
