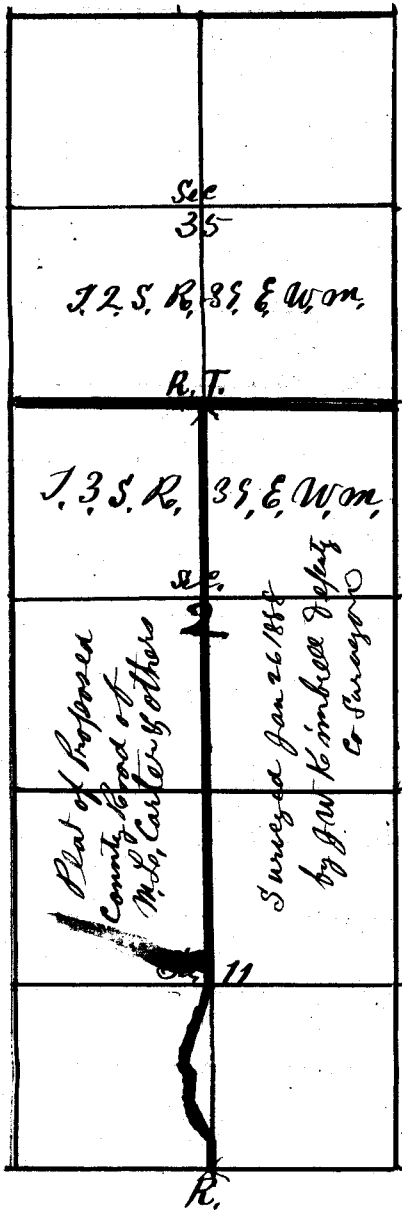

And at this time come Mr Parker and represents to the Court that the county ought to pay the damages that the appraisers have awarded Mr Beach herein. And the Court having thoroughly considered the matter are still of the opinion that the road is not of sufficient public utility to warrant the County Court in ordering said damages paid by the county, and that in case said road is opened the County will necessarily incur the expense of building a bridge over Grande Ronde River, which this Court is of the opinion is as much as the County ought to pay on said proposed road present. This matter comes on for consideration on the matter of the Delinquent Tax List. And the court finds that there is a long list of Delinquents on the Tax List, many of whom could and should pay their taxes and if they will not pay, they should be compelled to pay, by the sheriff, who is falling far short of his sworn duty, which is greatly to the prejudice of those who pay their taxes, in returning parties delinquent time and again, and year after year, when they can and should be made to pay. These delinquents pay no interest to the county if they eventually pay the tax, while the county has to pay interest on her indebtedness. And the longer the payment of taxes is delayed the more of it is lost entirely. Now therefore the court instructs and requires the sheriff to proceed with all possible dispatch to collect all Delinquent Tax that can be collected by levy and sale of property if necessary.
