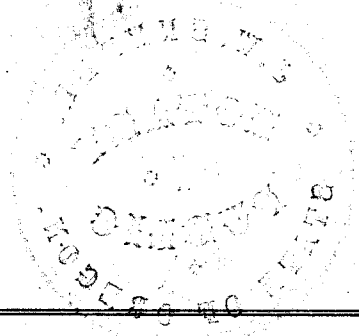

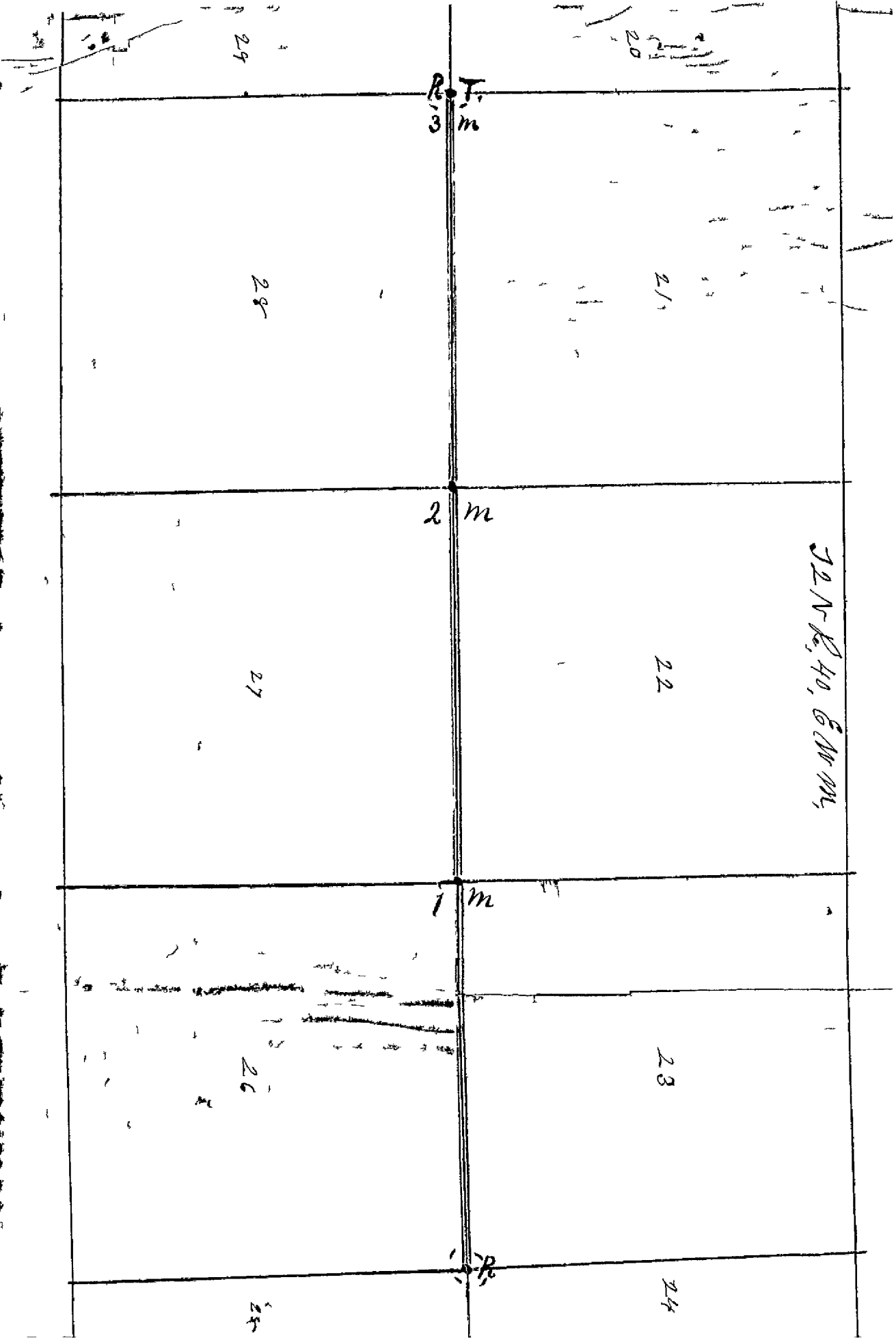
REPORT OF VIEWERS.
