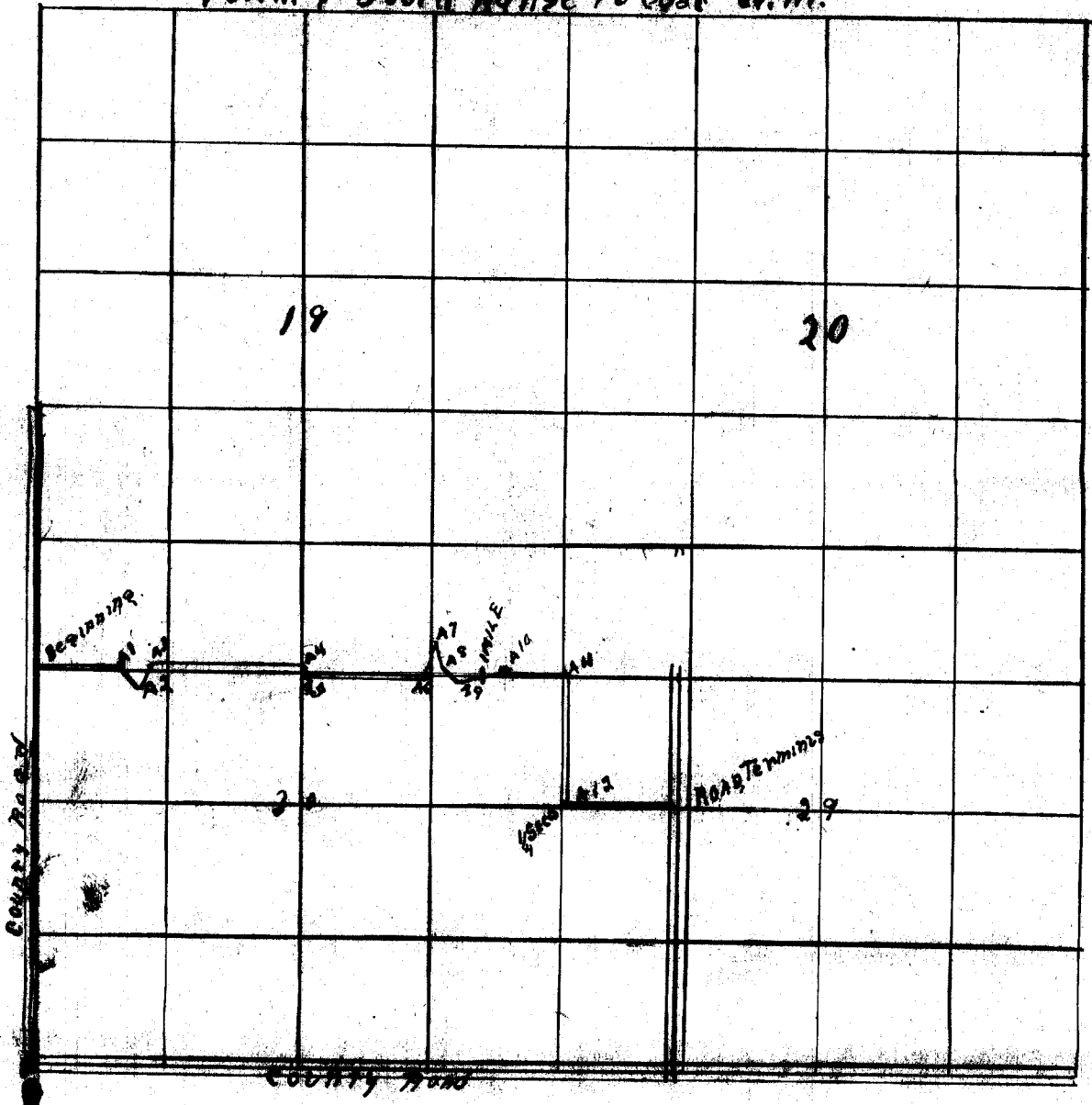

Fifth: No persons shall be employed by Road Supervisors at the expense of the general fund of the County without first being authorized by the County Court.

Sixth: Road Supervisors will keep all County roads open and free of obstructions of every kind and character and their special attention is directed to the prevention of injury to road by reason of irrigating ditches and water used for irrigating purposes and persons maintaining irrigating ditches across County roads must be required to have suitable boxes for the water to flow in across such highway for at least 40 feet in width of the same.
