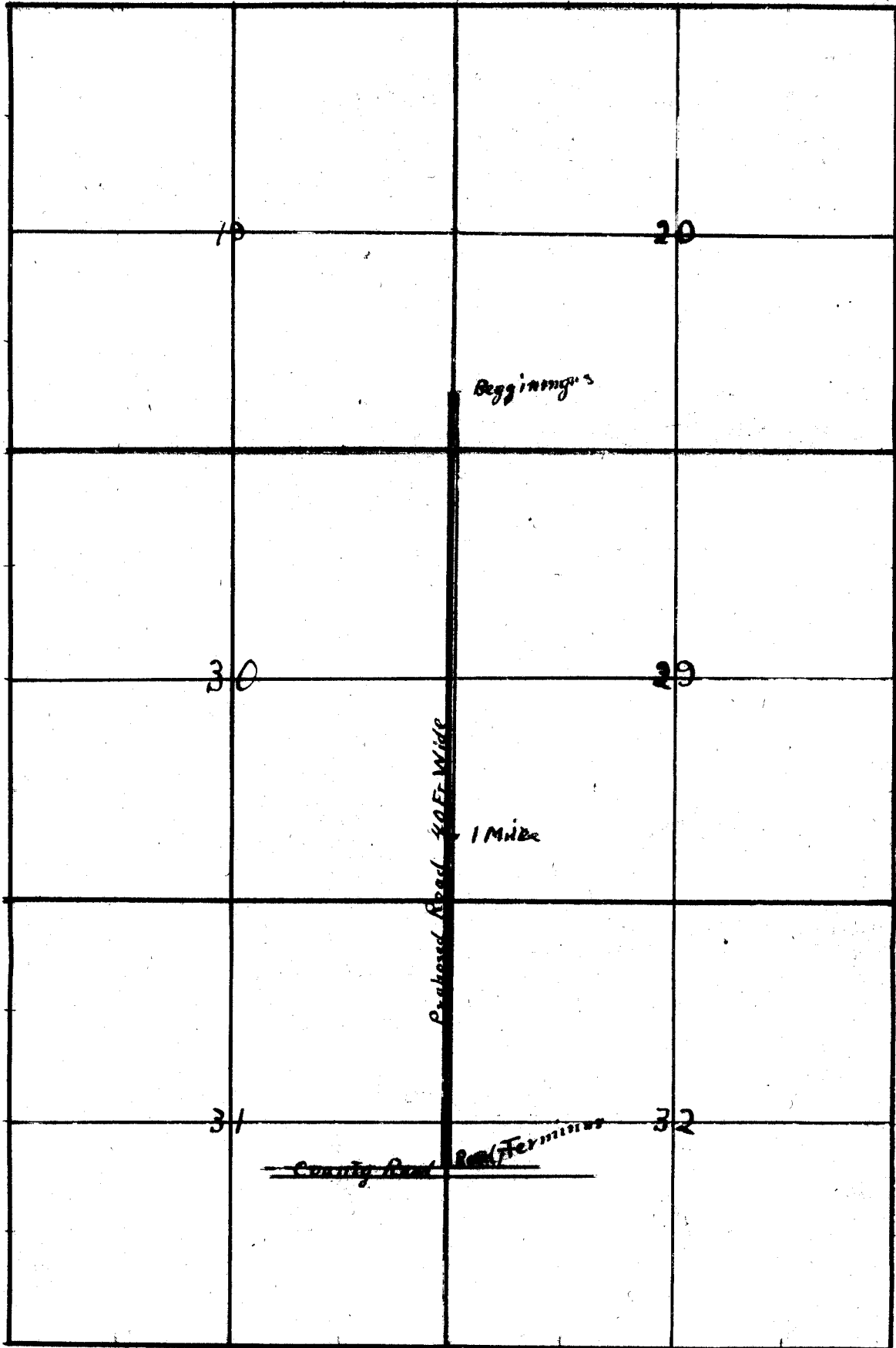

Commencing at a point forty rods North of the North East corner of Section Thirty (30) Township Two (2) South of Range Thirty Eight (38) E. 4th M., and thence South on the section line, between Sections Nineteen and Twenty, Twenty Nine, Thirty, Thirty one and Thirty Two, said Township and Range to intersect the County Road running through said sections 31st and 32nd, and there terminating. Said proposed road to be forty feet in width. And it appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by more than twelve householders of this County, residing in the vicinity of said proposed road, and that said petition properly specifies the place of beginning, intermediate points and place of termination of said road, and it satisfactorily appearing to the Court that notice has been given by advertisement posted at the place of holding County Court, to-wit: At the Court House in the town of Union, County of Union, State of Oregon, and also in three public places in the vicinity of said proposed road, to-wit: 1 at the point of beginning of said proposed road to wit: at a point 40 rods North of the corner of Sec 30. M., and BEK 11, Arnold & Dray's addition to Lalsprauk, from sale thereof to Union County for delinquent taxes for the years 1892, 1893, 1894, 1896, from which it appears that said Block was assessed to A. Dray, Estate for the year 1892, and together with other lots sold to Union County for delinquent taxes for the said year 1892, for the sum of \$22.⁵⁵; that the SW^{1/4} NW^{1/4} Sec 20, Tp 3 S. R. 38 E. W. M. was together with other property assessed to Mr. J. P. Beck for the year 1893, and sold to Union County for delinquent taxes for said year for the sum of \$; that BEK 11, & SW^{1/4} NW^{1/4} Sec 20, Tp 3 S. R. 38 E. W. M., together with other lots was assessed to Bryan, Grandy & Kinchard for the year 1894, and sold to Union County for delinquent taxes for the sum of \$29.⁹⁷; and for the year 1896, said decided lands and blocks was together with other lands assessed to Bryan, Grandy and Kinchard and sold to Union County for delinquent taxes for said year for the sum of \$16.⁹⁹.
