REPORT OF BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD VIEWERS.

To the Honorable County Court for Union County, Oregon.

The undersigned Board of County Road Viewers, heretofore on the 5th day of July, A. D. 1918, instructed to view, lay out and survey the proposed County Road as petitioned for by U. S. Blacker and others, beg leave to report that on the 19th day of July, A. D. 1918, in pursuance with said order, we proceeded to view out said road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinion said road is practicable and would be of a general public benefit and should be constructed along the lines as indicated in the petition with the exception of a short distance near the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. between sections 19 and 30 in Tp. 4 S. R. 40 East of W. M. where said road should run diagonally across the land owned by J. E. Wilkeson. This newly proposed road will add greatly to the convenience of the petitioners who reside in Ramo Flat vicinity owing to the fact that the newly proposed route will be less subject to snow drifts which have heretofore prevented travel on the present road during the winter months.

We beg to make the following recommendations:--

(1) That the proposed road be laid out, marked, and made a public highway.

(2) That the proposed alignment be altered near the $\frac{1}{4}$ Section corner between Section 19 & 30 so that the road will run diagonally across the Wilkeson tract thus eliminating grade and distance.

(3) That J. E. Wilkeson be allowed damages to the extent of \$25.00 per. acre for all land lying above the irrigation ditch which may be covered by said proposed road where same crosses his property.

(4) That A. Slater and J. E. Wilkeson be allowed damages to the extent of \$200.00 per. acre for all land lying below said irrigation ditch which may be covered by said road.

(5) That the petitioners be requested to donate labor to cover all work which can not be done with the county road grader. It is the opinion of the viewers that petitioners should furnish the labor necessary to perform the rock work near the south end of the proposed road where it will be impossible to use the road grader and that for this work the county should furnish only one man and any necessary powder for blasting purposes.

Now at this time it is ORDERED that this matter be and the same is hereby continued for the term.
