Doty, et al., beg leave to report that on the 28th day of Sept., 1921, in pursuance with said order, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinions said proposed road should be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon: that the same is practicable and would add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out -- declared a public highway of said county 60 ft. wide. We agreed to pay Mr. F. G. Killian twenty-five and no/100 dollars (\$25.00) for damages as the road goes through his cleared and plowed land.

And it appearing to the Court that said Board of County Road Viewers is favorable and that they recommend that said proposed road be established as a County Road and declared a public highway of Union County, Oregon, and all the proceedings herein having been legal and according to law and no remonstrance or claim for damages having been filed other than the damages recommended in the Viewers' report, and there having been no cause shown why this proposed road should not be declared a public highway and ordered open, and the Court being satisfied from the report of the Viewers that said road will be of public utility,

It is therefore CONSIDERED and ORDERED that said report be accepted and placed on record in the Journal of this Court and that the Surveyor's profile and plat of the proposed road and his field notes of the survey thereof be placed on record in the book of plats of County Roads of Union County, Oregon, and that said proposed road be and the same is

hereby declared a public highway of Union County, Oregon.

It is further ORDERED that the County Clerk be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant on the road fund of the County in favor of F. G. Killian as damages in accordance with the recommendation of the Board of County Road Viewers.

In the matter of discontinuing  
the County Library Service.

Now at this time the above entitled matter comes on for consideration, and it appearing to the Court that on December 20, 1921, the County Court of Union County entered into a contract with the Public Library of La Grande, Oregon, for the furnishing of library service throughout Union County, which contract provided that said service should continue until terminated in accordance with the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 357, General Laws of Oregon for 1919, and it now being desirable to discontinue said service,

It is on motion duly made and seconded unanimously voted by the County Court, sitting for the transaction of county business, to discontinue said service and withdraw the support of the County therefrom as soon as the laws governing said service will permit.

Thereupon it was ORDERED that Court be now adjourned for the term, the journal of today's proceedings having been read, approved, and here now signed.
