## history of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Joseph G. Gray on a joint venture with O'Dell under GLO contract Number 120, dated May 27, 1867. Surveyor General record states:

Set $1 / 4 \mathrm{sec}$ cor, deposited marked stone, and raised stone mound.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.
DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:
Found stone $12 \times 10 \times 4$ inches marked $1 / 4$, in a small mound of stone.

description of monument and accessories I established
to perpetuate the original location do this corner:
In place of the found stone, I set a $2 \frac{1^{\prime \prime}}{\prime \prime} \times 30^{\prime \prime}$ aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 25 inches in the ground, from which;

## NEW BEARING TREES:

A 11 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N $7^{\circ}$ E, 28.53 feet marked $1 / 4 \mathrm{~S} 15 \mathrm{BT}$
A 20 inch diameter Double Bole Ponderosa Pine bears S $54^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 19.80$ feet
marked 1/4 S22 on the left bole
A 21 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears $S 68^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 27.22$ feet marked $1 / 4 \times \mathrm{XT}$
A 8 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears $\mathrm{N} 61^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 19.93$ feet marked X BT
Buried stone north and alongside pipe.
Raised a mound of stone around monument, 3 foot base to top of cap. Painted a 6" red band around all BIs and attached Bearing Tree signs. Set a steel fence post approximately 3 feet East with Land Survey Monument sign attached.


I hereby certify that the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on June 21, 1994. Witnesses: Travis Foster and Pete Crabtree.


I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I used $20^{\circ}$ East magnetic declination and the distances are to a 50 d spike driven in the right side of the root crown. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 644 to the BT blaze.
