History of original corner establishment:

Corner established August 21, 1891 by John W. Kimball under G.L.O. contract. Surveyor General's notes state:

"78.00 summit of ridge and old indian trail, course S.E. and N.W. 80.00. Set stone 24"x10"x6" 6" in the ground. Note could not set deeper on account of rock underneath for corner to Sections 19, 20, 29, 30. Marked with two notches on S and 5 notches on East edges from which: A pine 14" in diameter bears $S31\frac{1}{2}$ E, 79 lks. distance marked T1N R38E S29 BT. A pine 14" in diameter bears S64 W, 219 lks. distance marked T1N R38E S 30 BT. A pine 22" in diameter bears N87 W, 217 lks. distance marked T1N R38E S19 BT. No other tree within bearing distance. Raised mound of stone $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high 3 feet wide at base along side."

Description of corner evidence found:

No trace of 24" x 16" x 6" set stone on steep north slope. Some stone laying in the area from possible mound. Found down tree on top of ridge scribed T1N R38E S29 BT, S31^OE, about 185'. Notes call for 79 links. (200 link error). Found standing pine snag 30" in dia. scribed T1N R38E S19 BT, N87^OW, 142'. (217 links). Found badly decomposed tree laying south of ridge, entire blaze remaining scribed T1N R38E S30 BT. Unable to locate exact original position, record (S64^OW 219 links).

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Jarbour

Set 2¹/₂" x 30" galvanized pipe with brass cap marked: Set pipe 22" in the ground with mound of stone to cap. From which a fir 14" in dia. bears N70°, 62.1 feet, scribed T1N R38E, S20 BT, a pine 18" in dia. bears S42°E, 49,9 feet scribed T1N R38E S29 BT, a fir 18" in dia. bears S59°W, 15.5 feet, scribed T1N R38E S30 BT. A fir 17" in dia. bears N11°W, 67.5 feet, scribed T1N R38E S19 BT. Placed 54-3s and 54-4s on BTs and standing snag. Painted blazes red. Painted 6" red band around BTs. Placed brass washer stamped PLS 1051 on foot blazes. Placed 54-2 and 54-4 on steel fence post 3' north of corner. Corner about 125' north of Smith Ridge.

A pine 14 ins. in dia. bears S 64° W 219 lks. (144.5 ft.) dist. marked T1N R38E S30 BT

A pine 22 ins. in dia. bears N 87° W 217 lks. 143.2 ft.) dist. marked T1N R38E S19 BT

Found standing pine snag 30 in. in dia. scribed T1N R38E S19 FT, N 87° W 142 ft. (217 links).

Found badly decomposed tree laying south of ridge, entire blaze remaining scribed T1N R38E S30 BT. Unable to locate exact original position, (record S 64° W 219 links). Set: $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" galvanized pipe with brass cap, 22 ins. in the ground with mound of stone

to cap, from which:

A fir 14 in. dia. bears N 70° (The plat is missing the E), 62.1 feet, scribed T1N R38E S20 BT





A 2 1/2" brasscap, marked as shown, on a 2 1/2" galvanized iron pipe, in a rock mound, 6" showing above the ground.

Found the original southeast BT dead & down with axe marks and BT signs at approximately S 31° E 185 ft.

Did not search for original southwest BT
