Description of corner evidence found:

Found 18x12x6 stone (1296 cu. in.) with chisle marks at fence corner . There were no other stones in the area.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner Set a 36"x1" iron pipe with a brass cap, 30" in the ground, for the corner to sections 27, 28, 33 & 34. I buried the stone to the North of the new corner.

New BT.

A ponderosa pine 40" in diameter bears N5W 27.88 feet to a nail and brass washer at the base of the tree (in the BT. blaze) Scribed T1N R38E S 28 BT.

No other trees practical.

I used a steel tape and a magnetic compass with Declination 20 degrees.
