## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND COPNER MONMMENTATION

## history of original corner establishment

Corner originally established by John W. Kimbrell under GLO contract no. 579, dated June 22, 1891. Surveyor General record states:

Set Post 3 feet long, 3 ins square 24 ins in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec Cor marked 4 S on N face, from which;
A fir 4 ins dia brs $N 86^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 22$ lks dist marked $\frac{4}{4} \mathrm{~S}$ BT
A Pine 32 ins dia brs $517^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 541 \mathrm{ks}$ dist marked $\frac{1}{4} \mathrm{~S}$ BT
Union County survey 26-70 calls finding the pine BT


Corner remonumented by Barry Barbour on May 31, 1979. Monumentation sheet 89-84R states:
Found no trace of wood post. From $30^{\prime \prime}$ pine snag, measured $N 17^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 35.6 \mathrm{ft}$. No trace of fir BT Set 2 " $\frac{1}{2} \times 30$ " galvanized pipe with brass cap marked: (Markings shown below)
Set pipe $24^{\prime \prime}$ in the ground and mound of stone around from which:
A $10^{\prime \prime}$ douglas fir bears $S 10^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 49.9 \mathrm{ft}$. scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S8 BT
A $16^{\prime \prime}$ pine bears $N 59^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 35.7 \mathrm{ft}$. scribed 4 S 5 BT
No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.

## DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap monument marked as shown: in small mound of stone.

Found 32 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine snag with scribing visible $\mathrm{S} 17 \mathrm{~W}^{\circ}, 54 \mathrm{lks}$

Found 17 inch diameter Douglas Fir $\mathrm{S} 10^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 49.9$ feet
live and vigorous with scribing visible
Found 18 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine N59 ${ }^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 35.7$ feet
live and vigorous with scribing visible.


DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESGORIES I ESTABLISHED
TO PERPETUATE THE OAIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:
From the found brass cap monument, I took additional accessories to the corner as follows:

NEW Bearing Trees:
A 12 inch diameter White Fir bears $\mathrm{N} 39^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 20.31$ feet, marked 4 S 5 BT
A 10 inch diameter white Fir bears $540^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 35.78$ feet, marked it S8 BT
Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet West with Land Survey Monument gign attached
Attached bearing tree signs to and painted a 6 inch red band around bearing trees.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I used $18^{\circ}$ East magnetic declination and the distances are to a 50 d spike driven at the root crown on the right side of the bearing tree. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 2219 to the BT blaze.

## History of original corner establishment:

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Corner established by John W. Kimbrell under GLO contract No. 579 in September, l891. Surveyors General's notes state: "Set post 3 ft . long, 3 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, for $1 / 4 \mathrm{sec}$. cor., marked $1 / 4 \mathrm{~S}$ on N . face, from which: A fir 4 ins. diam., bears N86º 22 lks. dist., marked l/4 S BT. A pine 32 ins. diam., bears S170\%, 54 lks. dist., marked $1 / 4 \mathrm{~S}$ BT."

## Description of corner evidence found:

Found no trace of wood post. From $30^{\prime \prime}$ pine sriag, measured N170E, 35.6 ft. No trace of fir BT. Magnetic variation used. N20 ${ }^{\circ}$ E.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:
At above described point set $2^{\prime \prime} 1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 30^{\prime \prime}$ galvanized pipe with brass cap marked: Set pipe $24^{\prime \prime}$ in the ground and mound of stone around. From which: A 10 " douglas fir bears Sl0 ${ }^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 49.9 \mathrm{ft}$. scribed $1 / 4$ S8 BT. A $16^{\prime \prime}$ pine bears $N 5^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 35.7 \mathrm{ft}$. TINR39E scribed $1 / 4$ S5 BT. Painted blazes red and $6^{\prime \prime}$ red band around. Placed 54-3 and brass washer stamped PLS 1051 on BTs.
