## Descripllon of corner eyldence found:

Found evidence of both bearing trees though the one in Section 27 is a rotted stump and the one in Section 34 is only a stump hole with rotted evidence of a pine stump. The size of the trees appear to fit the GLO notes, also the bearings and distances correspond to the GLO calls.

Description of monument and accessories lestablished to perpetvate the
original location of this corner
I restored this $\frac{1}{4}$ corner to its original position by using the GLO calls. I set a $5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 30^{\prime \prime}$ iron pin with a cap stamped RLC 645 in a mound of stone. I set two new bearing trees as follows:

A larch $7^{11}$ dia. vhich bears $N 65 \mathrm{~W}, 1.7$ feet scribed $\frac{1}{4} \mathrm{~S}$ S 27 BT . A larch $12^{\prime \prime}$ dia. णhich bears $S 50 \mathrm{E}, 26.0$ feet scribed $\frac{1}{4} \mathrm{~S}$ S 34 BT .
