
## **UNION COUNTY** CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION


Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At position determined by survey, I set a 5/8" x 30" rebar with aluminum cap marked as shown, 26 inches in the ground, from which:

A 14" Douglas Fir bears N86°W, 8.89 feet, marked CON 1/16 S 10 BT A 11" Tamarack bears S 33°W, 5.74 feet, marked C N 1/16 S 10 BT Set steel fence post 2 feet north.
