Found a basalt stone of called size in a mound of stone, no marks visible.

Found NE BT dead and down badly rotted, scribes visible.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At record bearing and distance from the stump hole of the found bearing tree, and in the mound of stone, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap 24" in the ground and raised a stone mound with a 3 ft base to the top of the cap, from which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 9" Ponderosa Pine bears N $60\frac{1}{2}$ ° E, a distance of 42.10 feet, marked X BT A 13" Ponderosa Pine bears S 78° E, a distance of 27.62 feet, marked T2N R40E S20 BT.

An 11" Ponderosa Pine bears S 62° W, a distance of 31.90 feet, marked T2N R40E S19 BT $$^{\circ}$$

An 11" Ponderosa Pine bears N 11 $^{\circ}$ W, a distance of 51.70 feet, marked T2N R40E S18 BT
