

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the South Boundary of  
the Umatilla Indian Reservation,  
T. 2 S., R. 34 E., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.  $74\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E.,  $39\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist.,  
with scribe marks UIR MP 65 BT and a nail and washer  
at base of partially healed blaze.

S.  $89^{\circ} 48' 00''$  W., on the 66th mile.

Ascend broken NE. slope, through timber and light undergrowth.

5.630 Point for the closing cor. on the N. and S. center line of sec.  
33, for that portion of the section north of the Reservation  
boundary, hereinafter described.

25.550 Point for the closing cor. on the N. and S. center line of the  
SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 33, for that portion of the section north of the  
Reservation boundary, hereinafter described.

29.85 Top of ascent; thence over level ground.

39.835 The 65 $\frac{1}{2}$  Mile Corner on the S. bdy. of the Umatilla Indian  
Reservation, perpetuated and recorded by Barry B. Barbour,  
Registered Land Surveyor No. 1051, in 1980, monumented with an  
iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 10 ins. above  
ground, with brass cap mkd.

A larch snag, 9 ins. diam., bears N.  $43^{\circ}$  E., 19 lks.  
dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 18 lks.)

A larch, 14 ins. diam., bears S.  $55\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 10 lks.  
dist., no marks visible. (Record, S.  $57^{\circ}$  E., 9 lks.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by Barbour

A larch, 17 ins. diam., bears N.  $46^{\circ}$  E.,  $43\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist.,  
with scribe marks UIR MP 65 $\frac{1}{2}$  BT and a nail and washer  
at base of partially healed blaze.

The corner is located on NW. slope, 5 lks. N. of a barbed wire  
fence, 4 strands, bears generally E. and W.
