
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

A-19

History of original corner establishment: Corner established in 1882 by Herman D. Gradon, under General Land Office Contract No. 452.

Surveyor General Records (Notes) states: Pine post 4' long 3" thick 2' in ground from which a pine 15" dia. bears N14°E 138 lks. dist. A fir 20" dia. bears S14°W 75 lks.



(No subsequent remonumentations in county records)

Description of corner evidence found:

Found 24 in. ponderosa pine, live in good condition, marked 1/4 S, positioned 1/4 corner between Section 35 and 2, $S14^{\circ}W$, 91 ft. dist. from notch in blaze.

Description of monument and accessories 1 established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Set 30 in. x $2\frac{1}{2}$ in. iron pipe with 3 in. brass cap marked as shown 6 in. in the ground to solid rock and chiseled an "X" in rock under pipe for the 1/4 Section Corner between Sections 35 & 4, and raised a mound of stone 4 ft. in diam. and $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high around the pipe, from which new BT's - TIS R3

A 20 in. fir bears S60[°]W 86.9 ft. marked T2S R36E 1/4 S2 BT. Measurement taken to a brass washer in face of blaze. Set steel fence post approximately 5 ft. west with warning sign attached.

TIS R36E S 3<u>5</u> S 2 T 2 S 1972 PLS 848

Used steel tape and magnetic compass with declanation = 20° East.
