
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

This corner was not set in the original survey.

A survey was made by J.L.Curtis in 1890, number 126, recorded on page 271 of the old survey book. No description of the corners he set was recorded.

The position, determined by survey lands in a water course and could be washed out, at a point S 88°43'17"E, 8.00 feet, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 22 inches in the ground, as a witness corner from which;

A 5/8" X 30" rebar bears N 43°E, 9.27 feet, with alumin cap marked NE RP. A 5/8" X 30" rebar bears S 62°E, 5.57 feet, with alumin cap marked SE RP. A 16" Douglas Fir bears S 81°W, 21.25 feet, marked C1/4 S25 BT


A 9" White Fir bears N 64°W, 34.65 feet, marked X BT

Raised a small mound of stone around monument, to top of cap.
