A 15" diam. Douglas Fir stob bears North $58^{\circ}$ East, a dist. of 52.60 ft., dead and standing 6 ft . tall with healed blaze.
A 32" diam. Ponderosa Pine stob bears South $39^{\circ}$ East, a dist. of 95.35 (rec. 93.50) ft., dead and standing 6 ft. tall with scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.
An 11" diam. Ponderosa Pine bears South $62^{\circ}$ West, a dist. of $33.40 \mathrm{ft}$. , alive and vigorous with scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.
A 37 " diam. Ponderosa Pine bears North $30^{\circ}$ West, a dist. of $80.80 \mathrm{ft} .$, alive and vigorous with scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.
