History of original corner establishments

Original contract for survey was contract No. 452 dated June 16, 1882

The original notes are as follows: Set a post 3 ft long 3^{H} square 24^{H} in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face From which:

A pine 15" in diam bears N 20°W 37 lks dist marked \$\frac{1}{4}S BT. A pine 10" in diam bears \$20°W 75 lks dist marked \$\frac{1}{4}S BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

A yellow pine 22" in diam bears N20°W 37 lks dist marked \$\frac{1}{4}\$ BT.



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Set 2" galvanized pipe 30^{M} long with a bronze cap on top and a 8^{M} plate welded to bottom. The pipe is set in a hole 22^{M} deep and back filled with stone and tamped soil.

I stamped the disk

\$17 S20 ORE LIC 381 1969

From the corner the original bearing tree is; A pine 22" in diameter bears N20°W 37 lks distance.

I established a new bearing tree as follows; A fir 9" in diam. bears S30°W 21.8 ft. to BT scribe at base of tree and tree is marked with scribe ‡S BT.

I placed a steel fence post at the corner with USFS sign 54-4 and a National Forest boundary sign indicating National Forest land to the south. I also placed USFS bearing tree signs on the bearing trees facing the corner.
