A pine $18^{\circ}$ in diam bears $529^{\circ} \mathrm{W} 59.7 \mathrm{ft}$. dist markpd $\frac{1}{4} \mathrm{SBT}$
( distance measured ta center of trees and marked with a scribe)
I set a stoel fence post with USFS sign 54-4 attached. A National Forest boundary sign was placed on the post indicating National Forest land to West and North. USFS bearing tree signs were placed on bearing trees shoulder high facing the corner.


## History of original corner establishment:

In 1882, under Contract No. 451, Rufus S. Moore set a stone $16 \times 9 \times 5$, from which a $50^{\prime \prime}$ Pine bears $N 72^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 32 \mathrm{lks}$. and a $9^{\prime \prime}$ Pine bears $S 18^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 75 \mathrm{lks}$.
