At the position of the comer I set a $2^{\prime \prime}$ in galvanized pipe $30^{\prime \prime}$ long with bronze cap on top and $8^{\prime \prime}$ plate welded to bottom. The pipe sot to a depth of $24^{\prime \prime}$.

I stamped the disk.
