Henry M. Thatcher under GLo Contract No. 320 ,
dated April 1, 1879. The Surveyor General Record states:

Set stone $21 \times 7 \times 7$ for $1 / 4 \mathrm{sec}$. Cor. Raised stone

In 1990 the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) conducted a dependent resurvey in T. 5S., R.41E., W.M., under Group Nos. 1000 and 1484 . This survey was executed by Philip G. Griffin, Cadastral surveyor and commenced July 9, 1990 and was completed April 13, 1992. The following is the BLM's record for this corner:

In 1971 this corner was remonumented from original evidence by steven D. Albright, BLM Cadastral Surveyor. In 1991 BLM Surveyor Griffin reports: The $1 / 4$ sec. cor. of secs. 14 and 23 , monumented with an iron post, $2 \%$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 3 ins. above ground, in a mound of stone, $21 / 2 \mathrm{ft}$. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.
