A pi:a $21^{\prime \prime}$ in diam bears $560^{\circ} \mathrm{W} 40.4 \mathrm{ft}$. dist. with scribe and tree is good condition. No evidence of tree in section 34.


Description of monument and accessories I established to perpefvate the original lecetion of this corner

At the position we found the stone I set a $2^{\prime \prime}$ galvanized nipe $30^{\prime \prime}$ long with bronze cap on top and8" plate welded to bottom. The pipe set to a depth of $15^{\prime \prime}$ and backfilled with stone and tamped soil. Raised a stone monument and set the marked stone on north side of pipe.
