At the position of the corner I set a $2^{\prime \prime}$ galvanized pipe $30^{\prime \prime}$ long with bronze cap on top and $8^{\prime \prime}$ plate welded to bottom The pipe set to a depth of $24^{\prime \prime}$.

I stamped the disk.

From the position of the corner the original bearing tree is; A tamarack $18^{\prime \prime}$ in diam bears $\mathrm{S} 61{ }^{\circ} \mathrm{W} 53$ ks dist. I set the following new bearing trees;
A tamarack $13^{\prime \prime}$ in diam bears S32 ${ }^{\circ}$ E 29.6 ft. dist marked T6S R35E
SIBT; A tamarack 14 in diam bears $N 55^{\circ} \mathrm{E} 35 \mathrm{ft}$. dist marked T5S R35E S32 BT; Distance measured to center of the respective trees and marked with a scribe. I set a steel fence post with USFS sign 54-4 attached. USFS National Forest boundary signs were attached to post indicating National Forest land to South and West. We nailed the original post to a tree adjacent to corner.

A $72^{\prime \prime}$ ponderosa pine bears $\mathrm{N} 35^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$ (orig. $\mathrm{N} 35^{\circ} \mathrm{W}$ ), 176 lks . dead \& down
A careful examination of the dead \& down 72" ponderosa pine indicates the tree did not twist as it fell and that the blaze did in fact face Southwest while it was still standing. Evidence that supports this is the shape of the root wad and the shape of the root hole match. Also the pieces of root still in the ground match pieces of the root wad still attached to the tree showing the position of the blaze on the Southwest side of the tree. Other supporting evidence is the distance more closely fits to the standard corner closed on in the original survey and the bearing to the section corner south is closer to parallel to the range line and the other two north-south section lines to the west.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:
No permanent monument was set at the original closing corner location. A traverse point was set at the original location, and the intersection point of the east line of sec. 2 and the first standard parallel south lies $N 00^{\circ} 44^{\prime} 22^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{W}, 2.13 \mathrm{ft}$. The new closing corner at the intersection point is described on another certificate of monumentation. Accessories are referenced to the new corner only and are shown on that record of monumentation.
