WHEREAS, Union County received a Petition for Vacation on April 10, 1986, to vacate Seventh (7th) Street, south four hundred fifty-seven (457) feet from Stanley Lane to Fir Street, changing the roadway to a 30-foot easement road;




WHEREAS, the County Court received opposition to the petition in its entirety;
