## History of original corner establishment

Corner originally established by William H. Odell \& Joseph Gray under Joint GLO Contract Number 120, dated May 27. 1867. Surveyor General record states:
Set post for cor. to secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36 FROM WHICH:

A Pine $9^{\prime \prime}$ diameter , bears $N 15^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 38 \mathrm{lks}$ dist, marked T1N R 40 E S25 BT.
A Pine $8^{\prime \prime}$ diameter, bears $\mathrm{S} 70^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 108 \mathrm{lks}$. dist. marked T1N R 40E S 36 BT.
A Pine 14" diameter, bears S $25^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 213$ lks.
dist. marked T1N R 40E, S 35 BT


A Pine 12" diameter, bears N $70 \mathrm{~W}, 140$ lks. dist. marked TIN R 40E S 26 BT.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

NE BT.
Found an 18" Ponderosa Pine Snag, dead and standing with scribes visible. SE BT.
Found Stump hole at the record position of the SE BT.

## Description of monument and accessories I established

to perpetuate the original location of this corner:
At the record bearing and distance from the found bearing tree, I set a $2 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{x}$ 30 " aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 24 inches in the ground from which;

New Bearing Trees:
A 16 inch diameter Douglas Fir Bears $N 45^{\circ}$ E, a distance of 45.57 feet, marked T1N R40E S 25 BT.
A 13 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears $S 40^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$ a distance of 75.56 feet, marked T1N R40E S 36 BT.
A 9 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears $S 49^{\circ} \mathrm{W}$, a distance of 12.48 feet, marked T1N R40E S 35 BT.
A 13 inch diameter Douglas Fir bears $N 46^{\circ} \mathrm{W}$, a distance of 21.15 feet, marked T1N R40E S 26 BT. I placed the spike on the left of the root crown for measurement.

NOTE: This monumentation record was not filed at the time of monumentation. This documentation was found in our records. I am filing this to document the monumentation of this corner in 1991.

I hereby certify that the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on July 17, 1991.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used $17^{\circ}$ East declination, the distances are to a 50d spike driven in the right side of the root crown, except as stated above. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 991 to the bearing tree blaze.
