
No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records. DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:



A 5/8" x 30" rebar with aluminum cap bears S27°E, a distance of 6.15 feet, marked "BGB SURVEY MARKER SE RP". A 5/8" x 30" rebar with aluminum cap bears S48°W, a distance of 7.60 feet, marked "BGB SURVEY MARKER SW RP". A 5/8" x 30" rebar with aluminum cap bears N21°W, a distance of 8.38 feet, marked "BGB SURVEY MARKER NW RP".
