Description of corner evidence found:

At assumed corner location I found no evidence of wooden post.

Found alive 38" P. pine bears N 50 E, 159 lks.; face grown over though a portion of face is visible.

Found approx. 30" pine stump bears N 61 W, 166 1ks. with BT visible on a face that has been chopped out.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

I set a 2" galv. iron pipe with brass cap approx. 4" above the surface of the ground in a mound of stone 3 ft. dia. and 8" high. Cap stamped as shown above.

Set one new bearing tree: A 11" P. pine bears N 28 W, 79.42 ft. scribed 1 S BT.
