A 8 inch Ponderosa Pine bears S48°E, a distance of 190.90 feet, marked X BT. A 10 inch Douglas Fir bears S82°W, a distance of 34.64 feet, marked X BT. A 10 inch Douglas Fir bears N31°W, a distance of 64.97 feet, marked 1/4 S8 BT.


