CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

This $\frac{1}{4}$ corner was set by Deputy Surveyor Henry Meldrum, under Contract No. 450, dated June 11, 1882. He states he set a post 3 ft. long 3 in. sq., 24 in. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the north face; from which he set:

A pine 8 in. dia. bears N 80 E, 101 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT. A pine 4 in. dia. bears S 40 E, 169 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT. He also noted crossing streams at 35.30 ch., 39.15 ch. and the edge of Indian Creek at 42.80 ch.

Description of corner evidence found:

In the vicinity of the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner I found a large meadow with three streams running in a converging manner into the meadow. Using Mr. Meldrums stream calls and fitting them to the streams, I found a l in. iron wagon axel driven into the ground with a mound of stone along side the pin. The area has been cleared and there was no trace of witness trees. Further investigation revealed that the late John Traverso, father of Mrs. Olsen, had owned the property surrounding this wagon axel for over 65 years and that he had protected this point, as he said it was the true $\frac{1}{4}$ corner. This historical testimony, as related by Mrs. Olsen, helped to verify the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner position of which I accepted as the true $\frac{1}{4}$ corner position.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I set a Brass Cap on a 2 in. by 30 in. galvanized iron pipe set within 4 in. of the surface and being buried in a large mound of stone and earth. This point falls in a large meadow area with no suitable trees available as bearing trees. I set no additional references.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new tree accessory. I used 16° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the new bearing tree. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing tree. Bearing and distances to the iron pin accessory were determined by GPS observation with a Leica GS-15 unit. The Basis of Bearing is as per Survey Number 013-2015.
