


Found the tamrack down with scribe.;

A red fir 12" in diam bears N14°E a dist of 7.4 ft. Mkd 4s BT; A white fir 14" in diam bears S52°W a dist of 12.9 ft. Mkd ‡sBT;

### CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION


#### HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Henry Meldrum in GLO Contract Number 450, dated June 11, 1882. Surveyor General Field Notes state:

Set a post 3 ft. long, 3 inches square, 24 in. in ground for 1/4 Sec. Corner, from which:
A tamarack, 9 in. diam., bears N57°E, 12 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S. BT.

A Fir 5 in. diam. bears S65°W, 8 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S BT.

Corner brought to county standard by James Voelz in 1975 from original corner evidence. Union County monumentation record 191-84R states:



At the position of the corner, I set a 2" galvanized pipe with brass cap, 36" long approx 30" in ground from which I set the following bearing trees: A red fir 12" in diam bears N14°E a dist of 7.4 ft. mkd 1/4 S BT. A white fir 14" in diam bears S52°W, a dist of 12.9 ft. mkd 1/4 S BT.

#### DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 2 ½" iron pipe with 3" brass cap marked as shown below, 10 inches above ground, from which:

 $\tilde{\rm A}$  19 inch Douglas Fir bears North 14° East, a distance of 7.4 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.

A 19 inch Fir snag bears South 52° West, a distance of 12.9 feet, with healed blaze.

# DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

From the iron pipe monument,

#### NEW BEARING TREES:

A 10 inch Lodgepole Pine bears South 22° East, a distance of 31.80 feet, marked 1/4 s35 BT.

An 11 inch White Fir bears South  $66^{\circ}$  West, a distance of 39.20 feet, marked 1/4 S 35 BT.

A 6 inch White Fir bears North 70° West, a distance of 15.50 feet, marked 1/4 S34 BT.

Corner falls on East side of a fence corner.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I use a magnetic declination of 16° East. The distance to the bearing tree is to a 50d spike driven in the right side of the tree at the root crown. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 83571 to the BT blaze.
