## Description of corner evidence found:

Found $15 \times 10 \times 9$ inch stone, firmly set in small mound of stone and dimly marked $1 / 4$ on west face. A dead $18^{\prime \prime}$ tamarac bears N710 $\mathrm{E}, 16.0$ ft. with grown over blazes. Has $54-3$ and B. C. location tag. Magnetic Variation used. $\mathrm{N} 20^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At center of above described rock set 2 I/2" x $30^{\prime \prime}$ galvanized pipe with brass cap marked:
Set pipe $22^{\prime \prime}$ in the ground and mound of stone around to cap. Placed marked stone at base of pipe. From which: A $14^{\prime \prime}$ fir bears $N 48^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$, $82.0^{\circ} \mathrm{ft}$., scribed $1 / 4$ Slo BT. A $13^{\prime \prime}$ fir bears $547^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 70.8 \mathrm{ft}$. scribed $1 / 4$ S9 BT.Placed $54-3$ s and brass washer stamped PLS 1051 on Painted blazes red and $6^{\prime \prime}$ red band around. An $18^{\prime \prime}$ White Fir bears South $47^{\circ}$ West, a dist. of $70.80 \mathrm{ft.}$, alive and vigorous with healed blaze. (slated to be logged)
No sign of Northeast bearing tree.
