

## Description of corner evidence found:

Found $19 \times 16 \times 8$ inch stone, clearly marked with 3 notches on south and east siedes. No traced of south DTs due to road building. Found $21^{\prime \prime}$ pine, $N 40^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$, $11.0 \mathrm{ft}$. A $30^{\prime \prime}$ pine stump, $N 63^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 36.5 \mathrm{ft}$. with $B T$ blaze left.
Magnetic Variation used. $N 20^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At center of the above described stone, set 2 l/2"
T3NR40E x 30 " galvanized pipe with brass cap marked: Set pipe $24^{\prime \prime}$ in the ground and mound of stone around to cap. Placed marked stone at base of pipe. From which: A $20^{\prime \prime}$ pine bears $\mathrm{S} 38^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 93.8 \mathrm{ft}$., OR PL 1051 scribed T3NR40E S22 BT. A fir $28^{\prime \prime}$ in diam. bears 1979 S150 W, 18.6 ft. scribed T3NR40E S2l BT . A $15^{\prime \prime}$ pine bears $\mathrm{N} 40^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 65.0$ ft. scribed T3NR40E SIG BT. Placed $54-3 \mathrm{~s}$ and brass washer stamped PLS 1051 on PTs. Placed 54-3 on old ATs. Painted blazes red and $6 "$ red band around.

## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

## HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Originally set by the subdivision of Township 3 North, Range 40 East by Herman Gradon in Contract Number 517, dated
September 30, 1884. Surveyor General record states:
Set a basalt stone $16 \times 12 \times 12$ ins 11 ins in the ground for cor. to Secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22, marked with 3 notches on $S$. and 3 notches E. edges, from which:
A pine 10 ins. in diam. bears $N 10^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 15$ lks. dist., marked T3N R40 S15 BT.
A pine 30 ins. in diam. bears $N 65^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 59$ lks. dist., marked T3N R40E S16 BT.
A pine 8 ins. in diam. bears $567^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 15 \mathrm{lks}$. dist., marked T 3 N R40E S22 BT.
A pine 8 ins. in diam. bears $N 40^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 63$ lks. dist., marked T3N R40E S21 BT.

Corner found by Barry Barbour in 1979. Union County Surveyor monumentation record 212-83R states:
Found $19 \times 16 \times 8$ inch stone clearly marked with 3 notches on south and east edges. No traces of south Bts due to road building. Found $21^{\prime \prime}$ pine, $N 40^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 11.0 \mathrm{ft}$. A $30^{\prime \prime}$ pine stump, $N 63^{\circ} \mathrm{W}$, 36.5 ft. with BT blaze left.

A the center of the above described stone set $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " by $30 "$ galvanized pipe with brass cap marked as shown below: Set pipe 24 " in the ground and mound of stone around to cap. Placed marked stone at base of pipe. From which: A $20^{\prime \prime}$ pine bears $538^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 93.8 \mathrm{ft} .$, scribed T3NR4OE S22 BT. A $1^{\prime \prime}$ pine bears $N 40^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 65.0 \mathrm{ft}$. scribed T3NR40E S16 BT.

## DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 2 I/2" iron pipe with a $21 / 2 "$ brass cap, marked as shown below, 11 inches above ground, from which:
A 27 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North $42^{\circ}$ East, a distance of 11.0 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.
A 35 inch Douglas Fir bears South $11^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 18.6 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.
A 21 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North $43^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 65.0 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.
A 15 inch stump bears North $50^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 36.5 feet, with no scribe marks visible.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

NEW BEARING TREE:
A 12 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North $76^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 127.15 feet, marked X BT.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used $16^{\circ}$ East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the new bearing tree. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing tree.
