## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:
Corner originally established by William B Barr under GLO contract Number 443, dated May 29, 1882. Surveyor General record states:

Set lava rock $12 \times 12 \times 6$ marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the north for the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner from which;

A Pine 36 ins diam bears $\mathrm{N} 43^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 43 \mathrm{lks}$ dist.
A Pine 5 ins diam bears $S 6^{\circ} \mathrm{W} 70$ lis dist.


No record of subsequent monumentation found in Wallow County survey records DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found stone $12 \times 12 \times 6$ inches, with chisel marks, I am unable to read. The stone was in a rock jack approximately $30^{\prime}$ south of corner position.

Found a $36^{\prime \prime}$ pine stump $N 48^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 28.4$ feet, there are no scribes now, there is a Forest Service BT tag, dated 1961 - Forest Service report card states that there were scribes at that time.
Found a $26^{\prime \prime} \pm$ pine stump $\mathrm{S} 16^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 46.2$ feet, the vary bottom of the blaze is visible, no scribes.

## DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:
At record distances from the original BIs I set a $2 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 30^{\prime \prime}$ aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 22 inches in the ground, from which;

## NEW BEARING TREES:

A 15 inch diameter Douglas Fir bears $\mathrm{S} 67^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 25.32$ feet marked 4 S 23 BT
A 11 inch diameter White Fir bears $N 70^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 32.57$ feet marked $\frac{1}{4}$ Si BT
A 19 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears $S 72^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 61.88$ feet marked $\frac{1}{4} \mathrm{~S} 23 \mathrm{BT}$
A 23 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears $N 82^{\circ} \mathrm{W}$, 51.27 feet marked $\frac{1}{4}$ SI BT
Raised a mound of stone around monument, 4 ft . base to top of cap.
Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet East with
Land Survey Monument sign attached.
Buried the original corner stone East and alongside of Monument.
I hereby certify that the above corner point was
perpetuated as hereon described on October 11, 1993.
I found considerable local magnetic attraction in the area,
from 10 to 15 degrees.


I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I used $20^{\circ}$ East magnetic declination and the distances are to a 50d spike driven in the right side of the root crown. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 644 to the BT blaze.
