NARRATIVE

This survey was done at the request of Patrick Marolla on behalf of Hancock Forest Management, owner of the land within. Mr. Marolla wanted the North 1/16th corner between Sections 21 and 22 set prior to logging. In a survey dated 1916, the right of way map for the Oregon—Washington Railroad and Navigation Company shows a tie to the quarter corner between Sections 21 and 22. In Survey Number 19-89, Stryker uses this map to locate the Southeast corner of Section 21. I retrace Mr. Stryker's survey, and the railroad right of way to establish a position for the quarter corner. Upon searching, I can find no evidence of the original stone, however, a rotting 40 inch stump falls very close to the Northwest bearing tree position. Though I can find no remaining scribe marks on the stump, due to the relative harmony of the position in relationship to the railroad position, I accept this stump as being the original NW bearing tree. I set a monument at record bearing and distance from the center of the stump remains. From this corner, there are remnants of an old fence with additional fence posts running to the North. No wire remains.

I place the sixteenth corner as per BLM Manual of Instructions 2009. I find no unusual conditions with this survey.
