INTRODUCTION

The Union County Sheriffs Office is seeking the procurement of a mental health therapist for the assignment of providing services to the inmates incarcerated at the Union County Jail. The Union County Sheriff's Office operates a 37-bed adult jail in La Grande, OR. These services will be procured either through contracting with an individual or an organization. A contract will be offered to the proposer who submits the best proposal in compliance with this RFP in the discretion of UCSO.

Section 2: Description of Services

To perform the duties of Correctional Mental Health Therapist including but not limited to;

- Providing face to face services inside the Union County Jail for up to two hours per day Monday through Friday.
- Performing intake examination and screening of new inmates by way of a certified mental health screening instrument.
- Perform a variety of professional mental health services which are directly related to patient care of inmates such as treatment, plans, referrals, coordination of care, and basic discharge planning.
- Attend various community based mental health meetings/summits including MDT meetings as his/her schedule allows and as necessary.
- Advising Union County Sheriff's Office personnel on mental health best practices and practice and policy recommendations.
- Coordination of care for defendants in the custody of the Union County Sheriff's Office with other mental health providers in the community.
- Evaluation by a qualified mental health professional of mental health problems identified, upon intake into the Jail system, within 24-hours.
- Mental health evaluation of detainees exhibiting unusual or bizarre behavior within 24 hours of identification by Jail staff.

• Provide a cost for services reflected as either an hourly rate or monthly rate for retained services not to exceed 40 hours per month or 10 hours per week.

- Current licensing and/or certification held in the State of Oregon
- Knowledge of practices, principles and philosophy of mental health treatment including motivational interviewing, assessment, treatment plans, and crisis interventions.
- Experience working as a QMHP or a LCSW
- Must pass all criminal history check requirements as required by ORS 536-181.537 and in accordance with OAR 407-007-0200-407-007-0370 and drug screening.
